2021 CVEF GRANTS

- Slavery in Our Community, Eagle Scout Project: Acknowledges contributions of slaves and abolitionists from our towns.
- ➤ Witness Stones Project, Strong School: Student volunteers learn how to access and understand primary and secondary sources in tracing an enslaved person from our towns.
- ➤ Paper Prototypes, Memorial School: Students are inspired to be imaginative and creative in their problem solving by using a Cricut machine to make paper prototypes of their ideas.
- ➤ Statistical Evaluation of Employment Training, CRHS:
 Probability and Stats students partner with African Initiative for Rural Development in Kenya to analyze data of success rates of AIRD programs and make recommendations based on findings.
- Open Mic Initiative, Strong School: Monthly open mic nights. Local participants will be invited to share any creative art.
- Conscious Kids Reading Kits, Levi Coe Library: The Children's Room will create reading kits that introduce pre-K and elementary children to a variety of socially conscious topics.

- Snowshoe Squad, Memorial School: Purchase 12 sets of snowshoes and create Snowshoe Club, with students snowshoeing during recess and taking the equipment home for vacations and weekends.
- ➤ DIY Durham, Durham Public Library: Monthly DIY Take and Make Kits. Thirty kits will be distributed monthly featuring a variety of arts and crafts projects.



- > Stamping Kits, Levi Coe Library: Stamping kits, centered around holiday and greeting cards, will be made available for check-out.
- ➤ Community Conversations
 About Race, MiddlefieldDurham Racial Justice Team:
 Monthly conversations about
 race will continue to be held in
 cooperation with the Levi Coe
 and Durham Public libraries.

- ➤ Goatscaping, Brewster School: Goats will clear school property of invasive species, and programs about the purpose and benefits of goatscaping will be sponsored.
- ➤ Durham-Middlefield Residential Composting Pilot, Coginchaug Area Transition (CAT): Families participate in a composting project through DMIAAB. The goal is to decrease transfer costs and to help green our communities.
- Distance Theater, Phase II: Following up last year, for a second production of a live musical by local youth.
- ➤ Flexible Seating, Brewster School: Providing options for kindergardeners who learn better with chairs that rock, stools that can move and standing desks.
- ➤ Creative Mindfulness Kits, DMYFS: DMYFS will create and distribute arts kits with themes such as kindness, affirmation, de-stressing, journaling and gratitude.
- Complete Streets Durham: An education and safety campaign will be launched, designed to enhance walkability and safety on a planned pedestrian loop.

She was honored for the key role she played in establishing The Giving Garden, located behind Middlefield's Community Center. The garden, now ending its third season – besides being a lovely spot – provides fresh produce to those in need in the community. It is an all-volunteer effort that has become an important resource for Durham and Middlefield. Due to Covid restrictions last year, the "official" reception honoring Jen was held this year, on October 16, fittingly in the Giving Garden.

DONOR PROFILE

Durham resident Etzie Hevl, a founder and CVEF donor since 2008 says the answer to "Why do you donate?" is clear. "I believe in what CVEF is doing; it's as simple as that." And that's been her mantra from the beginning. "I knew the people who were pulling the organization together, and I admired them and supported their goal (of lifelong learning)."

Her commitment to education is not surprising. A Durham resident for 62 years, Etzie and her husband, Peter (who passed away in 2011), raised their three children here, all the way through the public school system. She was a Board of Education member for 18 years, the last 10 as BOE Chair.

Etzie points out it was her friendship with former Durham resident Norm Jason, another longtime CVEF donor who passed away



earlier this year, that helped broaden her interest in education. As a professional involved in the private school community (locally, Norm was head of the Independent Day School from 1979-1985), he added a new dimension to her thinking.

Reflecting on her "status" as a senior citizen, Etzie notes the list of organizations she donates to is now shrinking a bit. But CVEF will remain on it. "CVEF gets the community more involved, and it brings people together."
